REQUIREMENTS FOR 2016

PLANS FOR 2016

We anticipate having 15 mainstream classes and 3 support classes again as we have done this year. There will be very few staff changes.

Miss Myers will continue RFF Music for all classes K-6. However in Terms 2 and 4, students in Years 5 and 6 will have art lessons with Mrs Geary and/or Mrs Pex during their RFF sessions, instead of music.

We have been lent some brass musical instruments by The Entrance Public School. We can lease these cheaply to some students in our band to reduce costs to parents.

Sports In Schools will return for 5 weeks in Term 2 and then help with our athletics carnival.

Last week 6 teachers went to a two day professional learning course in preparation for leading the school in the implementation of PBL (Positive Behaviour For Learning). The whole school will begin implementing the program next year.

Mrs Hall and Mrs Flaxman spent three days last week in Melbourne, receiving additional training in AVID. They are very excited about the huge potential it has to improve student engagement and learning outcomes for our students. At this stage, it will still only be implanted in Stage 3 because K-2 teachers need to consolidate their professional learning in L3 next year, and Stage 2 will be undertaking professional learning to introduce *Focus on Reading* (FOR) which follows on from L3. However, in future years, the school my decide to implement AVID in other stages

CLASS END-OF-YEAR PARTY DAY
