KEEPING OUR STUDENTS SAFE AROUND SCHOOLS.



Over the last couple of weeks we have had a number of students crossing the road without using the pedestrian crossing. We have also had cars parking across the driveways in James Watt Drive causing a hazard for students walking to school. Here are some safety tips about keeping our students safe around school. Plan your trip to school so you use the pedestrian crossing.

Always hold your child's hand. Children need your help to spot dangers such as vehicles coming out of driveways. They can also be easily distracted and wander into traffic.

Drop off and pick up your child near the school gate and avoid calling them from across the road.

Park in designated car parks and follow the road rules by not parking across driveways.

Talk with your children about Stop, Look, Listen and Think every time they cross the road.

STOP ! one step back from the kerb.

LOOK ! for traffic to your right, left and right again.

LISTEN ! for the sounds of approaching traffic.

THINK ! whether it is safe to cross.

Young children can learn these safe pedestrian habits by watching adults model them and will then continue them later on when they are old enough to travel alone.

HEALTHY LUNCHES

Healthy lunches and snacks are important for active children. It is important to offer healthy lunch box choices. Tips include adding fresh fruit, crunchy vegetables and a combination of protein, dairy and carbohydrate foods.



Eating healthy food helps children concentrate and learn. Encourage your children to help choose and prepare their own lunch. They might like to make a list of the foods they enjoy. Praise your child when they choose healthy foods for their lunch box. When a child or an adult eats healthily and maintains a healthy body weight, they have less risk of developing chronic health problems such as diabetes or cardiovascular disease. Eating healthily and regular physical activity can lead to a healthy body weight, which can help to promote a child's self esteem. Make sure that fruits and vegetables are a part of lunch for your child. Low fat or non fat dairy should be selected over regular fat milk and cheese. Make lunch fun by packing a note for your child, cutting up healthy sandwiches into fun shapes or adding low fat flavoured milk to their lunch box and keep processed foods to a minimum.

EXCELLENT ACHIEVEMENT IN JUDO

Congratulations to Elke, in 5/6KL, who has had a very successful year in Judo. Elke completes in the senior girls division and earlier this year she won Gold at the NSW State Championships and was selected into the NSW team. At the Australian Championships in June Elke just missed out on Bronze coming 5th in Australia in her division. She recently completed at the Sydney International Open and was placed second, winning a Silver medal. Well done, Elke!
