CENTRAL COAST DANCE FESTIVAL

We are very proud of our students who participated last week and will be participating this week in the Central Coast Dance Festival. Supporting the development of performing arts skills of students and promoting the appreciation of the arts is important and the Dance Festival provides this opportunity for our students. I was lucky enough to attend the show last Wednesday night and will also be going again tonight to see our students dance. STUDENT SAFETY

Student safety is paramount at CBPS and we take our responsibility to keep students safe very seriously. The Department of Education has guidelines on lock downs and evacuations that we follow as a school. These procedures are detailed and all staff and students are aware of these procedures. Each term staff and students practise evacuations and lock downs so that we know what to do in an emergency. On Monday students and staff were involved in a practice evacuation drill. The practice evacuation went very smoothly and all students moved in a safe manner to the basketball courts just after recess before resuming regular classroom activities.

TREATMENT OF HEAD LICE

Head lice are a very common problem that most parents and teachers are more than familiar with. The school holidays is a great time to treat your child for head lice, just before they come back to school for Term 3. Here are some treatment tips:

- Do not treat your child if their scalp is irritated or inflamed
- Always read the head lice product label and directions before you apply it to your child's head. Products can be found in local chemists
- Apply the head lice product to every strand of your child's hair and work through, leave for 20 minutes, and comb out with a good quality lice comb
- Check your child's head and if dead lice are found, the product has worked. However make sure you re-treat your child's head in seven days to catch nymphs that have emerged from unhatched eggs
- Reduce the risk of your child catching head lice by tying their hair back or braiding it.

ADVICE ON USING SOCIAL MEDIA TIPS FOR PARENTS

Children often spend more time on social media during the holidays. Here are some tips on using social media:

- Talk with your kids about their digital lives & let them know you are always there for them.
- Protect personal information - teach your children how to turn on privacy settings.
- Encourage children to 'think before they click', to think about content and the consequences of posting it.
- Be an offline supporter. Encourage kids to have some screen-free time each day and turn off devices at bedtime.
- Teach kids to treat others the same way they'd like to be treated online and be zero-tolerant to rude or mean online behaviour.

TIPS FOR YOUNG PEOPLE

- Protect your personal settings, use strong passwords, change them regularly and don't share them.
- Have some screen-free time each day and turn off devices at bedtime.
- Treat others as you'd like to be treated online.
- Talk to an adult you trust if someone you know is being cyberbullied or you see something online that upsets you.

SCHOOL EXEMPTIONS/HOLIDAYS

If you are thinking of going on holidays during the school term, The Department of Education and Communities (DEC) has introduced procedures for registering 'Exemption from School' requests.

From the beginning of 2015, family holidays and travel are no longer considered under the Exemption from School Procedures. Travel outside of school holiday periods needs a Certificate of Extended Leave – Travel available from the school. While on vacations, parents may be asked to produce this certificate to ensure a child's leave-from-school has been authorised.

A Principal should accept a reason for travel during school term if it is in the best interests of the student, such as educational, social and participation reasons. This also includes family business, bereavement or other reasons, which should be specified on the application.

On accepting a parent's application, a Certificate of Extended Leave – Travel must be issued. This certificate is provided to the parent. A Principal may decline to accept a parent's Application for a Certificate of Extended Leave – Travel and then the parent will be advised in writing.

Travel outside of the vacation period will count as an absence on your child's school report.
