It is a time to celebrate Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander history, culture and achievements and is an opportunity to recognise the contributions that Indigenous Australians make to our country and our society. The theme for this year's NAIDOC week is 'Our Language Matters.'

At CBPS we will be celebrating NAIDOC Week in Week 10 from Monday to Thursday. On Monday we will have an Opening Ceremony at 9.05am, which parents are invited to attend. During the week students will take part in story time, Aboriginal art, Aboriginal games and a Closing Ceremony on Thursday.

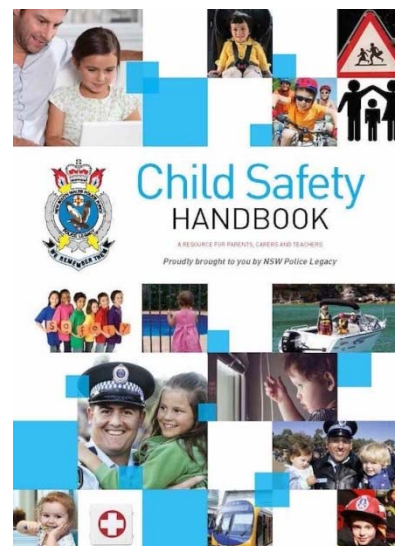
DIGITAL CHILD SAFETY HANDBOOK

All of the stars pledged will become part of a massive public art installation at the Gold Coast 2018 Commonwealth Games, compiled by Samoan-born Artist Maryann Talia Pau. Inspired by the words of Dr Martin Luther King Jnr, the installation is a symbol of our united effort to inspire light, hope, and love.

School reports are graded on the following two elements: Achievement and Application in class (Please note as per Department of Education and Communities report guidelines, Kindergarten students are not graded against achievement.)

Achievement: Application in class

E – Limited	L- Low
D – Basic	I- Inconsistent
C– Sound	S- Satisfactory
B– High	H- High
A– Outstanding	O- Outstanding

It is important to understand and reflect where your child is at academically at this time of the year as they prepare to move to a higher grade. Students who are achieving a Sound achievement are performing at the stage appropriate levels and are performing well in class. If your child receives a High or Outstanding achievement grading, that indicates that your child is able to demonstrate a higher level of understanding in that particular strand or subject area. If your child has an achievement level of Limited or Basic it indicates that your child may be experiencing some difficulties in the classroom. All students who achieve a Limited or Basic achievement level will be addressed at the stage level and where relevant, referred to the Learning Support Team for further discussion to help support their academic needs. Please do not hesitate to contact your classroom teacher if you would like to discuss your child's report and how you can help your child at home

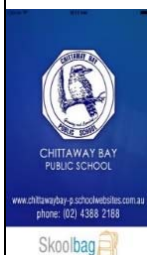

School App

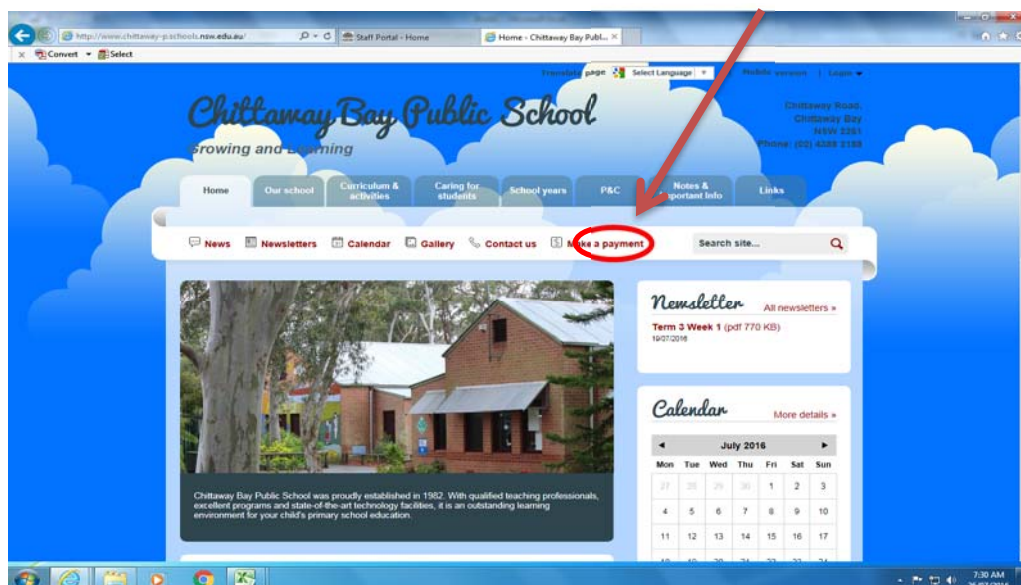
