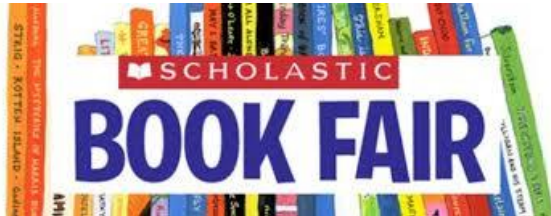

Cyberwise - Social Networking

Social networking is a large part of the social identity of young people. They are avid users of a range of social networking services including Facebook, YouTube, Snapchat, Instagram and Twitter. Many kids also network through playing online games like Club Penguin, Moshi Monsters and World of Warcraft.

All of these services provide fun and engaging ways to:

- ▶ Stay connected and interact with friends and family
- ▶ Post information and updates about themselves and their activities
- ▶ Share photos and videos
- ▶ Chat and play games
- ▶ Comment on other people's photos, posts and profiles.

It can be difficult to resist the 'pester power' of your kids when it comes to allowing them to engage on social media, especially when their friends may be allowed. Whilst there is a risk, they may feel alienated, there is increasing research showing the negative impacts of children accessing social media when they are not emotionally ready. Ultimately, you know your child best and whether they can handle the responsibilities and pressures of being on social media.

Here are some tips to follow when making the choice:

- ▶ Get in the know. Research time; 'terms of use', age requirements on social media services, and explain them to your child.
- ▶ Keep it private. Show your child how to use privacy settings to control what others can see.
- ▶ Play nice. Encourage your child to respect others online and to always think before posting.
- ▶ Report. Show your child how to report inappropriate content and cyberbullying.
- ▶ Beware of bad eggs. Teach your child that not everyone that they meet online can be trusted.
- ▶ Join in. Create an account yourself and find out what your child is likely to encounter.
- ▶ Talk. Maintain open communication with your child so they feel safe talking to you about any concerns.

Should my child be on social media?

Parents can sometimes feel the pressure of peer power to allow their children on social media, even if they don't feel comfortable doing so. While these services are a fun way to stay connected with others, there can be downsides like cyberbullying, risks to privacy and contact from strangers. If you allow your child to sign up to a social media service, consider these handy tips.

- Get in the know**
– research the 'terms of use' and age requirements on social media services and explain them to your child.
- Keep it private**
– show your child how to use privacy settings to control what others can see.
- Play nice**
– encourage your child to respect others online and to always think before posting.
- Report**
– show your child how to report inappropriate content, especially cyberbullying.
- Beware of bad eggs**
– teach your child that not everyone they meet online can be trusted, even if they seem nice or friendly.
- Join in**
– create an account yourself and find out what your child is likely to encounter.
- Talk**
– maintain open communication with your child so they feel safe talking to you about any concerns.

> Aussie kids are online

There were **1.49 million** children and young people online during April 2015. **1.04 million** or **70%** of them accessed social media or game sites.

> They're spending a lot of time socialising

Children and young people spent a total of **5.4 million hours** accessing social media or game sites in April 2015.

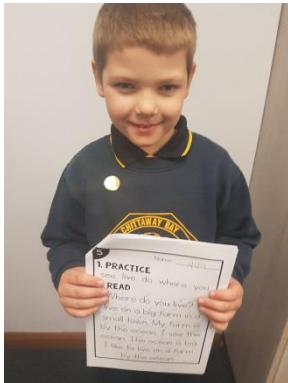
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Great Work

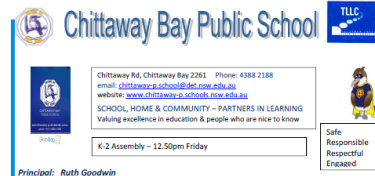
Our Kindergarten transition program will start with story time afternoons in September.



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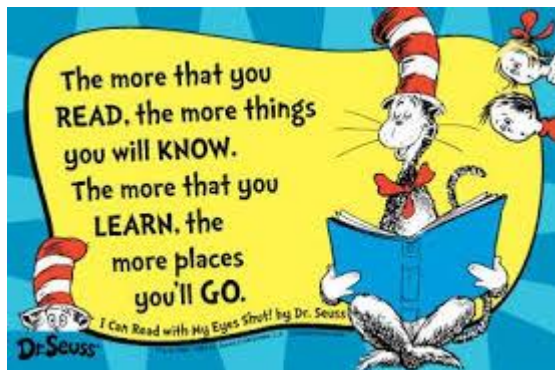


Newsletter via Emails, School App and Website

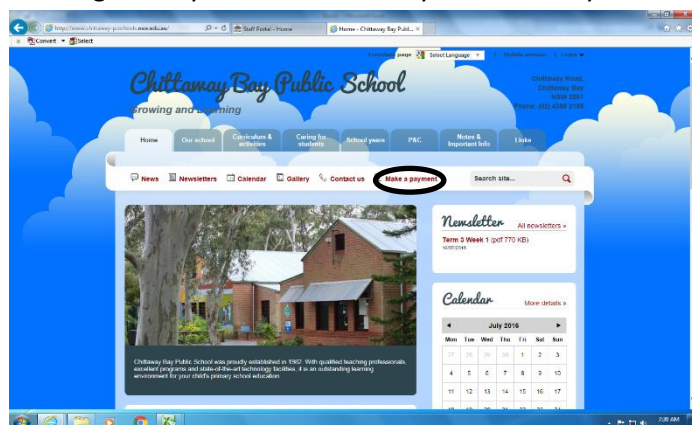
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Online payments
