Importantly, we want to remind everyone that:

- We ALL have a part to play in protecting ALL children
- Even small actions can help to improve a child's future
- By building stronger communities, we are creating safer environments for our children.

## **Mobile Devices**

Just a reminder that all mobile phones and devices should be handed in to the office in the morning before school and collected each afternoon at the end of the school day.

## **Cyberwise – Supporting your child's safe mobile phone use**

Mobile devices are great for keeping in touch and now with smartphones your child can connect online whenever and wherever they are.

You can support your child's use of their mobile phone by making them aware of the following:



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- \* Nothing is really ever free. Be wary of advertisements for free downloads; you may be automatically subscribed to a service which can become very expensive. When buying a phone, check details of the plan or contract and don't accept offers that sound too good to be true.
- \* Protect your privacy. Only give out your mobile number to people you know and trust. Don't give out other people's number without their permission.
- \* Think before you send or forward mobile content such as photos, texts and videos. Where might they end up?
- \* Activate security features so that if your phone is lost or stolen, you can protect your personal information.
- \* If your phone is lost or stolen, notify your network carrier and the police immediately. It is smart to record your unique International Mobile Equipment Identity (IMEI) number just in case it is lost or stolen in the future.
- \* Treat your phone like your wallet. Don't store bank PINs or other passwords in your phone. Use a pin code to lock your phone if possible.

## **PBL**

Each week as part of our Positive Behaviour for Learning we look at being Safe, Respectful, Responsible and Engaged. Having a smooth transition from class lines to the classroom in the mornings is an important start to the school day. To help this transition children should:

- Arrive at school by 8.50am
- Line up in their class lines when the bell rings
- Be ready to move to class at 8.55am

We ask that parents support this transition in the morning by allowing students to move to class with their teacher. If you would like to discuss something with your child's teacher please contact the office to make a time for a meeting.

**School Crossing Supervisors – Work with your community**  
**1 x Permanent Part-Time position – Chittaway Bay Public School – Central Coast (00005IVZ)**

An important person in a child's school life is the School Crossing Supervisor, who ensures they cross the road safely. The role requires minimal hours out of your day and gives something worthwhile back to the community.

The position is working 4 hours per fortnight with the hours of morning shift 8.10 to 9.10am and afternoon shift 2.40 to 3.40pm Monday to Friday during school terms. The base rate is \$21.91 - \$26.29 per hour.

All the qualifications you need are community spirit, good communication skills, an alert and professional attitude to work and a reliable personality. The casual hours and school holidays would suit a parent or grandparent, a retiree or anyone wanting meaningful work — but not full-time.

Training for your key responsibilities of directing traffic to stop at the designated crossing and giving clear instructions to infants and primary school students to cross the road safely, will be provided. You may be required to attend a health assessment. Appointment is subject to a Working with Children Check clearance.
