Treatment of head lice

Head lice are a very common problem that most parents and teachers are more than familiar with. The school holidays is a great time to treat your child for head lice, just before they come back to school for Term 2. Here are some treatment tips:

- Do not treat your child if their scalp is irritated or inflamed
- Always read the head lice product label and directions before you apply it to your child's head. Products can be found in local chemists
- Apply the head lice product to every strand of your child's hair and work through, leave for 20 minutes, and comb out with a good quality lice comb
- Check your child's head and if dead lice are found, the product has worked. However make sure you re-treat your child's head in seven days to catch nymphs that have emerged from unhatched eggs
- Reduce the risk of your child catching head lice by tying their hair back or braiding it.

Cyber Safe

Children often spend more time on the internet during the holidays and it is important to support our children to keep them safe. Here are a few tips about keeping children safe on the net:

- Be involved in your child's life – dedicate time to really understand your child. Know where they are, who they are with and what they are doing.
- Be cyber-aware: regularly monitor what they are looking at on the internet and on social media sites and do what you can to reduce their exposure to inappropriate content;
- place the computer or device in a common area of the house, so your child is less likely to try and access inappropriate web sites or use social media sites inappropriately; and



- consider using content filters to help control what your child can access.

2017 was a very successful year for students at Tuggerah Lakes Secondary College. Post-school destination data from TLSC – The Entrance Campus has revealed 113 students received university offers. These offers were to universities across NSW and Australia and included Bachelor degrees in: Advanced Studies, Animal and Veterinary Science, Applied Finance, Arts, Biomedical Science, Biotechnology, Business, Chiropractic Science, Commerce, Communication, Construction Management, Creative Arts, Criminology and Criminal Justice, Design and Interior Architecture, Engineering, Environmental Science and Management, Exercise and Sport Science, Fine Arts, Food Science and Human Nutrition, Global Business, Hellenic Studies, Human Sciences, Information Technology, Law, Liberal Arts and Science, Media, Medical Radiology, Medical Sciences, Medicinal Chemistry, Music, Nursing, Nutrition, Oral Health Therapy, Para-medicine, Primary Education, Professional Communication, Psychological Science, Public Health, Science, Secondary Education, Security Studies, Social Science, Speech Pathology, and Veterinary Science.

Of those students not seeking entry to university most have found apprenticeships/traineeships or employment in a range of areas including Electrical, Carpentry, Plumbing, Landscaping, Childcare, Hairdressing, Real Estate, Defence Force, Hospitality and Retail.

I would like to congratulate the 2017 Year 12 students and their families on such a tremendous outcome and thank their dedicated teachers across the Tuggerah Lakes Learning Community for their commitment and support in nurturing these students in their learning journeys from Kindergarten to Year 12.

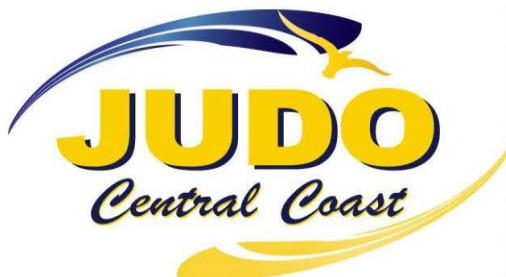

In order to verify yourself and your child, you will need your driver's licence and your child's birth certificate, but if you don't have these with you on the day, you can complete verification online at home.
