Attendance

At Chittaway Bay Public School we strive to have all of our students attend school each day. Rolls are marked every day by the classroom teacher. When students are absent from school they are required by law to produce an explanation from their parents by way of either a note, telephone call or Skoolbag notification with a suitable reason for their absence. If a note is not produced within 7 school days from the first day of absence, or at the time the child returns, the absence is declared as 'unexplained' in accordance with the DoE Attendance Policy. In Term 2 we will also be asking parents to provide an explanation by way of either a note, telephone call or Skoolbag notification with a suitable reason for their lateness or early departure when a child is late to school or leaves early. 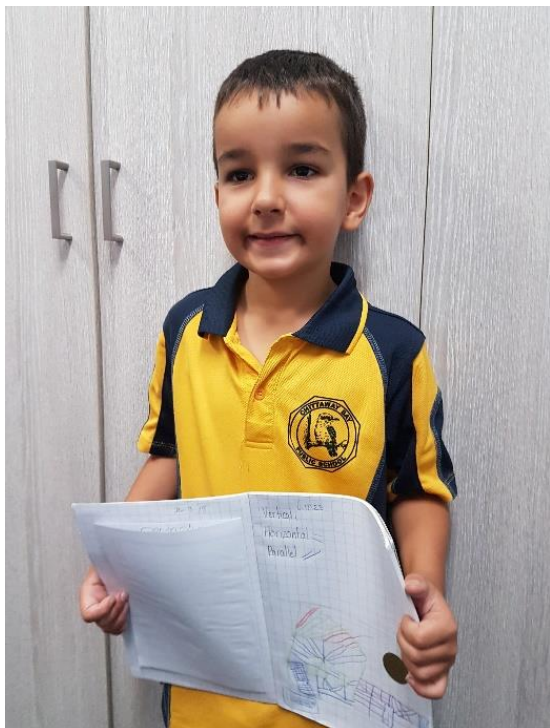
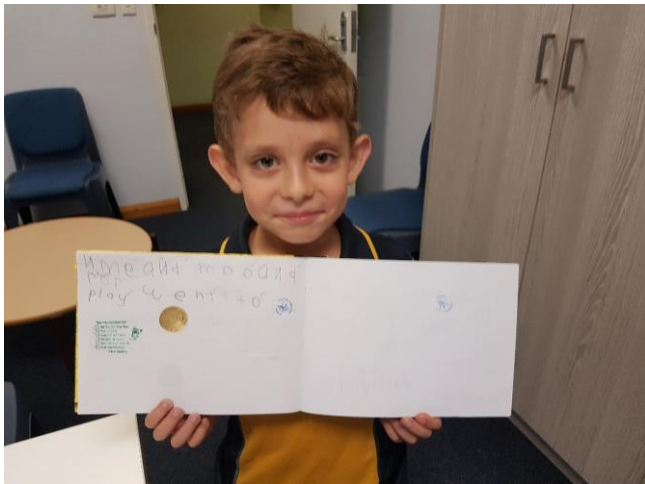
Any family not residing in our catchment area, is required to complete an Out of Zone (OOZ) Application to apply for enrolment – this includes families who currently have siblings at the school. The OOO committee, comprising of the Principal, a representative from the P&C and a staff representative, will meet to consider all OOO applications.

School Banking

Chittaway Bay is excited to offer the Commonwealth Bank School Banking program to all students.

School Banking is a fun, interactive and engaging way for young Australians to learn about money and develop good savings habits. Children who deposit money into their Youthsaver account through School Banking earn Dollarmites tokens, which they can save up and redeem for exciting rewards.

School Banking is also a great fundraiser for our school. Our school receives a Regular Savers Contribution of \$5 for every 10 deposits processed per student as well as an Annual Contribution which is based on the number of students who made at least one School Banking deposit in the prior year.

School Banking day is Wednesday. Each week you need to hand your bank book to your teacher for collection. If you are interested in opening a Commonwealth Bank Youthsaver account for your child you can visit commbank.com.au/schoolbanking and click on the link to open a Youthsaver account. A School Banking representative will be available at the Information Session to show you how you can do this. In order to verify yourself and your child, you will need your driver's licence and your child's birth certificate, but if you don't have these with you on the day, you can complete verification online at home.

Does my local school have an enrolment policy?

Each school has an enrolment policy which provides information for parents intending to enrol their children. All policies are consistent with Department of Education Enrolment Policies and Procedures.

When can my child commence school?

Preparedness for school varies from child to child. You are encouraged to discuss any concerns with current childcare providers or make an appointment to meet with school staff. Students are able to commence from as young as 4 years of age, providing they turn 5 on or before the 31st July of the commencement year. Compulsory school attendance for all students commences at 6 years of age.

I reside within the local school catchment area. Will there be a place for my child at Chittaway Bay Public School?

While you reside within the local catchment area, you are eligible to enrol your child at the school. Our office can provide confirmation that your address is within the school catchment area.

I do not reside within the Chittaway Bay Public School local catchment area. Am I able to enrol my child?

Applications for non-local placement may be lodged and will be assessed by a panel comprising both school and community representatives consistent with school policy. Non-local places are limited by the number of vacancies made possible in permanent classroom facilities.

I currently have a child attending Chittaway Bay Public School. I have since moved outside of the local school catchment zone. Is it possible for my other children to now be enrolled at Chittaway Bay Public School?

Families who relocate outside of the local catchment area will be eligible to enrol future children at their new local school. Non-local applications for siblings can be made, and will be assessed consistent with school enrolment policy. *Parents wishing to ensure all children attend the same primary school have the option to enrol all their children at their new local school.*

My child does not currently have a placement or has been placed upon a waiting list for enrolment at Chittaway Bay Public School. Are they able to participate in the school's Orientation Program?

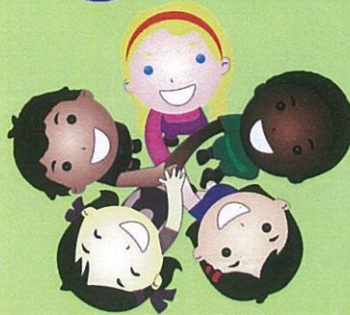
Students with a confirmed placement at Chittaway Bay Public School for the following year are eligible to participate in school's Orientation Program. Parents of all other children are encouraged to participate in any enrolment programs offered at their local designated school to assist with their transition to school.

When can I enrol my child?

Enrolments for the following year can be made from the beginning of the current calendar year. Families are encouraged to enrol early to enable the school to communicate relevant information to you throughout the year prior to enrolment. Early enrolment also assists the school to ascertain student numbers and plan staffing and resourcing. Successful enrolment made prior to the end of Term 3 of the preceding year will enable your child to be included in any Orientation Programs, usually held during Term 4.

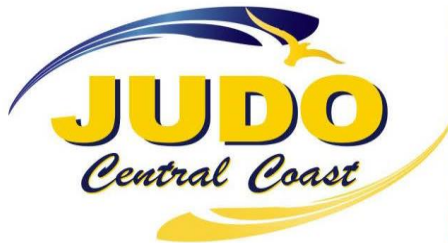
