#### Great Work @ CBPS


Last week Gryffin and Harvey from 2/3T came to show me the work they had been

#### SCHOOL HOLIDAY ROAD SAFETY REMINDER FOR FAMILIES

With the school holidays approaching, daily routines will soon change. Different play locations and holiday destinations means different traffic environments.

So to help keep our children safe, families are reminded about these key road safety points:

- Stop, look, listen, think every time you cross the road.
   If your child is aged 8 years or younger hold their hand when walking near or across roads. If your child is 9-10 years old always actively supervise them.
- 2. It's the law that everyone wears a helmet when riding a bike in a public place. It makes sense to wear a helmet when riding scooters and skateboards too!
- **3.** Click clack front 'n back every person for every trip. Everyone in the car must be securely buckled up in the right seatbelt or child restraint.

#### 4. Talk to your child about being a safe road user.

Reinforce safe road behaviours by being a good role model! Children learn safe road behaviours from the adults who care for them. Talk about what you are doing to be safe when near roads, in the car and when riding.

### 5. Point out road safety differences and dangers in new environments. This is especially important when on holidays in different surroundings. Roads, footpaths, parks, carparks, bike tracks and bike lanes may look different in holiday areas.

The best way to keep your child safe is to actively supervise them.

Talk and teach your child about road safety every time you are out an about.

Remind other adults who care for your children to do this too.

#### **Treatment of head lice**

Head lice are a very common problem that most parents and teachers are more than familiar with. The school holidays is a great time to treat your child for head lice, just before they come back to school for Term 1, 2019. Here are some treatment tips:

- Do not treat your child if their scalp is irritated or inflamed
- Always read the head lice product label and directions before you apply it to your child's head. Products can be found in local chemists
- Apply the head lice product to every strand of your child's hair and work through, leave for 20 minutes, and comb out with a good quality lice comb
- Check your child's head and if dead lice are found, the product has worked. However make sure you re-treat your child's head in seven days to catch nymphs that have emerged from unhatched eggs
- Reduce the risk of your child catching head lice by tying their hair back or braiding it.

#### SCHOOL BANKING



### **Parking Restrictions Outside Schools**

#### KIDS LOOK TO US TO KEEP THEM SAFE - PLEASE PARK LEGALLY IN SCHOOL ZONES

Central Coast Council would like to remind parents and carers of parking restrictions outside schools. Please pay close attention to the signs outside your child's school and be aware of speed when travelling through school zones.

#### NO STOPPING ZONE

Stopping is NOT permitted at any time.

#### BUS ZONE

Stopping is not permitted during the times shown on the sign.

#### DOUBLE PARKING ...

You are not permitted to stop GR pack alongside another vehicle already parked parallel to the kerb. This means not forming a queue in the middle of the traffic lane if you are waiting.

#### NO PARKING ZONE

Drivers may drop off and pick up children during the times shown on the sign BUT note:

- Maximum stopping time is 2 MINUTES your child must exit and enter the car within this time.
- Driver must remain within 3 METRES of the vehicle you may get out to assist with bags etc.
- Stop as close as possible to the top of the zone to allow access for vehicles following behind.

Parking illegally can create serious risks as it may limit the vision of other drivers.

#### SAFETY DOOR

The Safety Door is the rear door, closest to the kerb, footpath or gutter and away from the road. Always let your children gut of the vehicle on the FOOTPATH SIDE OF THE ROAD.

Please consider the school's neighbours by leaving space at their driveways to allow safe exit and entry to the roadway.

#### Road Rules 2014

269 Opening doors and getting out of a vehicle etc.
(3) A person must not cause a hazard to any person or vehicle by opening a door of a vehicle, leaving a door of a vehicle open, or getting off, or out of, a vehicle.
This offence attracts a level 5 penalty notice, which is currently set at \$337.

Stopping ON or ACROSS a driveway or other access point to and from a property is pot-permitted under any circumstances.

Travelling more than 40 km/hour through school zones may inhibit a car from stopping in time to avoid hitting a pedestrian.

It only takes a split second for a crash to occur and only one car to present a danger to an unknowing child.



Please be aware of the restrictions and park safely outside your child's school.

#### January Social Skills Groups

Child's Play Speech Pathology is excited to begin offering Social Skills Group Programs 2019 for our friends in early primary school!

Held in the January 2019 school holidays, the program will be made up of five 90 minute sessions and will target a number of social skills to help each child as the head back to school. The groups will include a maximum of 4 participants, so numbers are very limited.

Social skills are an important part of communication, and have a big impact on a child's ability to succeed academically, socially and emotionally. Social skills can also be some of the most challenging to master.

#### About the Social Skills Group Program

In our Social Skills groups we will work on helping your child develop and strengthen some of the essential skills they will need, including:

- 1. Understanding body language and non-verbal information
- 2. Taking turns in conversation and play
- 3. Staying on topic
- 4. Empathising and perspective taking
- 5. Making friends and developing friendships

Before we commence the social skills group, you will be asked to complete a brief pragmatics profile, to help us best understand your child's social development. Each session will cover a different topic and aspect of social skills development. After each of the group sessions, you and your child will receive a homework task that continues to target that sessions topic at home. At the conclusion of the group program, you will also be provided with a brief report outlining your child's performance and achievements.





### Opal for school students

The School Opal card gives eligible school students free Or subsidised travel on public transport **between home and school** On trains , buses, ferries and light rail in the Opal network

### Don't forget a Child/Youth Opal card

It's important to remember that the School Opal card is only for travel to and from school on school days only

and doesn't cover travel to After School Care, school excursions, sport and other activities away from school, so it's a good idea to get a <u>Child/Youth Opal card</u> for personal travel.

#### Are there any restrictions on when and where I can use a School Opal Card?

Yes, a School Opal Card is for approved travel on School days only between your home and school, it covers travel that commences between 6:30am and 7pm weekdays only.

For travel outside these times you should use a Child/Youth Opal card.

#### What should I do if my School Opal card is lost, damaged or stolen?

Report it online and order a replacement School Opal card and a fee may apply. By doing this, the old School Opal card will be cancelled and a new one will be mailed to the customer's preferred address within five to seven days. While waiting for a replacement card, show the driver a copy of the receipt or use a child/youth Opal card to travel if eligible.

#### Are there any alternatives to the School Opal card for ineligible students?

Students who are not eligible for a School Opal card may be eligible to purchase a term bus pass from Transport for NSW or they can get a Child/Youth Opal Card from more than, 2100 retailers, online at opal.com.au or by calling 13 67 25 (13 OPAL).
