I know it is a valuable experience for the students and hope they engage fully to get the most out of the learning opportunities and the excitement of being on camp.

Student Parliament

We are in the middle of our nomination for School Leaders for 2020. We have had a great group of leaders for 2019. They will conduct some final formalities as they conclude their roles and hand over to the new leaders. Parents of Year 5 students might like to discuss the opportunity with their children. We have done that here at school and nominations are now open. Students nominated must have a good behaviour record and be positive role models to other students. Each nominee must have another person (student or teacher) second their nomination. They will also be required to present their election speech to Year 2-5 ready by Week 8 starting Dec 2.

End of Year Activities

We have lots of things happening at school at the end of year. There are many busy days on our calendar and preparations for 2020 are also underway. We have sent home notes for Stage 2 (Year 3 and 4) and Stage 3 (Year 5 and 6) end of year excursions. These are a fun way to end the year with their current peers.

Presentation Ceremonies

We will celebrate the achievement of students during Week 9. Students in Kindergarten, IO/IS and MC classes will participate in a school ceremony on Wednesday December 11. Kindergarten students will also be recognised for completing their first year of school. On December 12 at Tuggerah Lakes Secondary Campus Berkeley Vale Campus at 6pm, we will be hosting our annual presentation evening to recognise students in Year 1 -6 for their 2019 achievements. Families will receive invitations for this if their child/children will be receiving an award.

Breakfast Club

You will all know that we have a breakfast club on Mondays. We always finish this up a few weeks early each year and just wanted to let you know that yesterday was the last morning of the year for breakfast club. We will be renewing this again in 2020, with some new toasters and as always, appreciate any and all donations of bread and





spreads to support us to deliver this for our students. Thanks to Mrs Geary and Miss Myers for spending the time each week to coordinate this program.

Bushfire Period

Last week NSW experienced unprecedented fire conditions that presented significant challenges for communities right across the state. Moments like these can cause great uncertainty for parents, students and staff as situations change rapidly.

Although it was necessary to temporarily cease operations at a large number of schools on Tuesday, we were able to remain open, the safety of students and staff is always paramount. We aimed to ensure communication with our community and appreciated the support and understanding during this time. We remain aware of the current conditions and make daily decisions regarding student safety, such as keeping students indoors during periods of poor air quality.

Building Works

You may have noticed some works occurring at Chittaway Bay PS. There are a lot of things happening. The Department are funding additional works to improve areas within the school. This is happening in most public schools and is part of the NSW government commitment to eliminating maintenance backlogs, which is very welcome. It is great to have improvements for our community and the students, which include some of the following: asphalting part of courts, walkway and the carpark, new covered walkway, repair of back of COLA, painting, carpeting, Wet Area upgrades in A and B block, drainage and some guttering. There are also some school funded works which I have initiated, including electronic gates, foyer remodel and the creation of a flexible learning space for STEM activities. I also have signage being installed around the school prior to end of term, pending scheduling. The asphalting of staff carpark will mean that for a day or two, there will be NO access to the staff carpark for staff, parents or any community members. I will give as much notice of this on Skoolbag and Facebook, please be patient as we complete these works.

All these works require us to be vigilant around Health and Safety. Please remind your children to stay away from fenced off areas as we have been doing here at school. I hope you enjoy the improvements for the students of our great school. It is anticipated the majority of the works are completed by school holidays. Some works in the Support unit will occur after Dec 18 to avoid disruption to those classes. I am also looking to freshen up the canteen façade. Please let me know your feedback if you are or will be upset by the murals being painted over in coming weeks to allow for renewal of that space.

I have also been advised by council that the bus bay will be asphalted on Dec 19. It is my understanding that this will include the entire bus bay area, which will be a welcome enhancement of our school entry. There will be no vehicle access to this area on Dec 19.

Information from Envision Hands.

What sort of bottle caps are acceptable?

Envision currently use all flat soft drink, water and milk bottle tops, including those from long life containers. The tops should be numbered either No 2 or No 4 in the recycled triangle but not all are marked. We cannot process tops which have other plastic or metal attached – this includes water bottle tops which have pull up tops. Any tops with other numbers like 5 or 7 are not required. We also ask that the caps are cleaned before they are donated and that no extra plastic, metal or other material is attached. Thank you so much for supporting Envision Hands.

How many lids does it take to make a hand?

Approximately 250 lids are used to make a small hand, however the wastage ends up being approximately 500 lids by the time it has been made.

For an arm, approximately 500 lids are used with a wastage of approximately 1000 caps.



If you are interested in your child taking part in these lessons, please notify the school office.



























Don't forget a Child/Youth Opal card

It's important to remember that the School Opal card is only for travel to and from school on school days only

and doesn't cover travel to After School Care, school excursions, sport and other activities away from school, so it's a good idea to get a <u>Child/Youth Opal card</u> for personal travel.

Are there any restrictions on when and where I can use a School Opal Card?

Yes, a School Opal Card is for approved travel on School days only between your home and school, it covers travel that commences between 6:30am and 7pm weekdays only.

For travel outside these times you should use a Child/Youth Opal card.

What should I do if my School Opal card is lost, damaged or stolen?

Report it online and order a replacement School Opal card and a fee may apply. By doing this, the old School Opal card will be cancelled and a new one will be mailed to the customer's preferred address within five to seven days. While waiting for a replacement card, show the driver a copy of the receipt or use a child/youth Opal card to travel if eligible.

Are there any alternatives to the School Opal card for ineligible students?

Students who are not eligible for a School Opal card may be eligible to purchase a term bus pass from Transport for NSW or they can get a Child/Youth Opal Card from more than, 2100 retailers, online at opal.com.au or by calling 13 67 25 (13 OPAL).
